The Twenty-Second Day of April Two Thousand and Twenty-Six

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An Assembly of Principals and Electors of the Parish of St. Peter will be held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday 22 April at 6.00pm to: -

- 1. Receive, and if deemed advisable, approve the Act of the Parish Assembly held on Wednesday 25 February 2026.**
- 2 To nominate a Constables Officer for Vingtaine des Augerez for a period of three years.**
- 3 To nominate a Constables Officer for Vingtaine St Nicolas for a period of three years as the term of office is due to expire May 2026.**
- 4. To nominate a Roads Inspector for Vingtaine Coin Varin to continue the term of office of Peter D'Anger who has recently become Procureur of the Parish.**
- 5. To nominate two members for the St Peters Youth & Community Centre Committee, the term of office due to expire July 2026.**
- 6. Take into consideration the following recommendations to the Assembly of Governor, Bailiff and Jurats of Licenses for the year 2026.**

Reason Change of owner for continuous trading of the Bowling Centre with same categories as currently held.

1. On the proposition of **Paul Townsend**, seconded by **Joao Camara**, the minutes of the Parish Assembly on 25 February 2026, which had been previously handed out, were approved.

2. **Sally Johnson** stood and addressed the Assembly to propose and nominate Oliver Simon (or Ollie as she has always known him) for the position of Constables Officer for Vingtaine des Augerez. She has known Ollie since he was a young man, who has grown up to be a good person, went to Agricultural college and his dream was to own his own business and he is now a young entrepreneur in the making. He would be a huge asset to the Honorary police. His nomination was seconded by **Mark Capern**.

As there were no other nominations, the Constable thanked him for volunteering and advised him the the swearing in is on Friday 01 May 2026.

3. Narendra Bisht was nominated for his Third term of office as a Constables Officer for Vingtaine St Nicholas by **Michael Holley** who stated that Narendra does a good job and is willing to re-stand for a further 3 years. He was seconded by **Jenny Holley**.

As there were no further nominations, the Constable thanked Narendra for his service and will be duly sworn in on Friday 01 May 2026.

Joao Camara , Chef de Police stood to thank Narendra but stated that Narendra is away so could not attend court that day therefore the Constable advised an alternative date will be sorted.

4. The Constable asked if there were any nominations for a Roads Inspector for Vingtaine du Coin Varin.

Paul Townsend stood to nominate Kerry Sharman for the role. He has known Kerry for 30+ years and taught him everything he knows about tarmac !and feels he would make a good Roads Inspector, this nomination was seconded by **Keith Capern**, he stated that Kerry had previously volunteered on the Youth & Community Committee and did a stirring job and feel he would do the same as a Roads Inspector.

A further nomination was proposed by **Roger Noel** for **Jonathan Gready** who was unfortunately absent as the Assembly meeting had , had to change date, to be a Roads Inspector; he has known him for a quite a few years but this would be his first position within the municipality. Jonathan is a man of standing as he has been involved with the Aero Club and the Rotary club for many years. This nomination was seconded by **Zoe Rive**.

As there was two nominations for the one position an official vote took place by way of voting slips, these were collected and checked by **Mark Capern** and **Rector Robert Harris** with the result being Thirteen votes for Jonathan Gready and Twelve votes for Kerry Sharman. The Constable thanked both candidates and asked for his congratulations to be passed on. He also thanked Kerry Sharman and stated that when a new position within the roads team becomes available, he will ask Kerry if he would still be interested.

5. **Mark Capern** stood to nominate **Timothy Renault** for the role of member for the St Peters Youth & Community Centre. Tim has worked within the committee for a number of years now and is also the Chairperson of St Peters Youth club so links the two. This was seconded by **Sally Johnson**. A further nomination for **Warren Moss** was proposed by **Mark Capern**, Warren has done two terms within the committee and is willing to continue, he is a Father with children attending St Peters School so links here and offers great support to the Centre. He was seconded by **Sally Johnson**. As there were no further nominations, the Constable thanked them both for their continued service.

6. The Constable advised the Assembly that this was purely a technical matter as the establishment was previously Jersey Bowl, simply a change of ownership with exactly the same categories.

Dean Cheetham stood to represent Tamba Bowl Limited, he said that yes, everything was basically the same, the establishment was purchased by Jonathan Ruff in February 2026 who has put in a large investment to refurbish the property but still catering for families, children's parties and corporate events with all three categories required.

Any questions, to which there were none. The proposition was proposed by **Steve Cummins** and seconded by **Darren Lyons**. As there were no queries, the Constable wished Dean the best and said long may the establishment continue and is pleased it's a new investment for the Parish. He advised that the Licensing bench will be on Thursday 18 June 2026.

As there were no further business, the Constable thanked everyone for attending.
