Reason. New Application

Occasional sale of alcoholic beverages ancillary to school organised fundraising, Social and Community events.

- 1 On the proposition of Joao Camara, and seconded by Robert Harris ,the minutes of the previous assembly held on 20 July 2026, which had been previously handed out, were approved.**
- 2 Advocate Mark Boothman of Boothman Jones addressed the Assembly. He advised that St Georges school were applying for both a First and Third category licences. This would enable the school on relevantly few occasions through out the school year to do events at the school. They are not reliant on the licences on a day-to-day basis. For example, at the Christmas Fayre, they would organise Mulled wine and Cider on a limited basis, not expecting to abuse the sale of alcoholic beverages.**

They are hoping to re-introduce the school board and in the past, they have held events but the sale of alcohol has been done by a Third Party applying for a special permit. This way parents could help contribute to fund raising for the school by paying for drinks at the various events. The Constable commented that this would avoid the transference of the licence to somewhere else.

Mr Boothman confirmed that the school Bursar, Mr Alex Richardson, subject to the court, would be the proposed registered manager of the licences, he has worked previously at Les Quennevais School so is aware of what is required to hold the licences.

This application was proposed by **Carli Price** and seconded by **Julie Hannabus**.

The Chef de Police, Joao Camara has no objections to the application.

The Constable confirmed that licence checks would have to be organised if the licences are given.

A parishioner questioned that would the licences allow other organisations to use the school for functions and therefore should we ask that the permit should state, 'Ancillary to the school', this will preclude outsiders coming into the school.

Advocate Boothman stated that there would be no change to what they have done before whereas third parties have hired the school for events and they have applied for their own alcohol licence as a special permit. This would not change; the St Georges licence would be ancillary to the schools fundraising events as stated in their application.

The Constable was reluctant to put conditions on the licences; the school has held events before and there has never been an issue so catering companies will still apply.

Chef de Police, Joao Camara stated he was not expecting the school to be holding events on a regular basis.

The Constable was satisfied that no restrictive conditions be put on the licences as not going to be used for this purpose, he therefore asked for a vote from the assembly to confirm no restrictions, All For no restrictions except the one parishioner who queried it.

The Constable asked if there were any other comments to which there were none.

Majority for the application, with only the one abstention. (11 people attended the Assembly which included the Constable, Rector, two Procureurs and the Parish Secretary).

The Constable advised that the licensing court is to be held on 24 September 2026.

As there were no further business the Constable thanked everyone for attending.

This concluded the business of the Assembly.
